## **April Speaker – Gerhard Graumann**

Growing up in the Pacific Northwest, Gerhard learned to fish and hunt at an early age. When not out in the wilderness with his father, he would spend time on the shores of Lake Washington fishing for perch and bass or targeting steelhead and resident rainbows in the Cedar River. In school,



Gerhard's main interest was in anything science related and this started him down the road of applying science to his fishing practices. Shortly after graduating from Renton High School, Gerhard headed off for a seven year stint in the United States Marine Corps as an avionics technician. The skills he picked up in the service would later play a large part in his understanding and success in his fishing activities. After his time in the Marine Corps came to an end, Gerhard found work in Redmond, WA with a company that specializes in aircraft flight controls, and is still working for that same company to this day. After purchasing a boat, with the intent of fishing Puget Sound, Lake Washington became a test bed of sorts to practice various fishing techniques, especially downrigger fishing. It was during these test runs that Gerhard developed a great understanding of the lake's fishery and his borderline obsession with the native cutthroat trout found in its waters.

Gerhard currently sits on the Adaptive Management Work Group for Cedar River Sockeye as well as leading the Remote Site Incubator program for Eastside streams of the Lake Washington system.

## Youth Fishing Derby Opportunities Kids Fishing Derbies for 2023




We are so excited to see these fishing derbies for kids back on this year!

Anyone wanting to help or need more information please contact Russell Carver 253-318-8523 Volunteer signup sheets will be available at the club meetings.














## Neah Bay Outing - July 13-15

## **Tip of the Month - Spot Prawns**

Spot prawns (*Pandalus platyceros*) are little sea creatures that have a delicate texture and amazingly sweet taste that many liken to a combination of the best lobster and fresh-churned butter.

The average life span for a spot prawn is around **six years**. It's around year four or five when something magical happens: spot prawns start transitioning from male to female. Spot prawns start life as males, then they join the other team after their first spawn as males.

Many Puget Sound marine areas open for recreational spot shrimp fishing beginning May 25, including the reopening of Elliott Bay for the 2023 season.

Hood Canal and Discovery Bay, meanwhile, will open May 26.

#### **2023 Puget Sound recreational spot shrimp seasons:**

Marine Area 4 east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh Line: Open daily beginning May 25, daylight hours. The recreational spot shrimp season closes when the quota is met.

Marine Area 5 (western Strait of Juan de Fuca): Open daily beginning May 25, daylight hours. The recreational spot shrimp season closes when the quota is met.

Marine Area 6 (Port Angeles Harbor, eastern Strait of Juan de Fuca, excluding the Discovery Bay Shrimp District): Open May 25-28, June 8-10, June 22-24, July 7-10, and July 21-23. Daylight hours.

Marine Area 6 (Discovery Bay Shrimp District): Open on May 26 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. only.

Marine Area 7 South (Iceberg Point, Point Colville, Biz Point, Salmon Bank): Open May 25-28 and June 8-10. Daylight hours.

Marine Area 7 East (northern Rosario Strait, Bellingham Bay, Sucia and Matia islands, Strait of Georgia): Open May 25-28 and June 8-10. Daylight hours.

Marine Area 7 West (San Juan Channel, Speiden Channel, Stuart and Waldron islands): Open May 25-28, June 8-10, June 22-24, and July 7-10. Daylight hours.

Marine Areas 8-1 (Saratoga Passage, Deception Pass) and 8-2 (Port Susan, Port Gardner, Everett): Open on May 25 and June 9 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. only.

Marine Area 9 (Edmonds, Port Townsend Bay, Admiralty Inlet): Open on May 25 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. only.

Marine Area 10 (Elliott Bay): Open May 25 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. (this is the portion of Marine Area 10 east of a line from West Point to Alki Point).

Marine Area 10 (outside Elliott Bay): Open May 25 from 9 a.m. to 1p.m. (this is the portion of Marine Area 10 west of a line from West Point to Alki Point, which includes the Bainbridge Island shrimp fishing grounds).

Marine Area 11 (Tacoma-Vashon Island): Open May 25 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Marine Area 12 (Hood Canal Shrimp District): Open on May 26, June 9, June 11, June 24, and June 28 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. only.

Marine Area 13 (South Puget Sound, Carr Inlet): Closed for spot shrimp harvest again this season due to continued low abundance.

Daily limit of 10 pounds, heads and tails, of all shrimp species combined (maximum of 80 spot shrimp, if open for spot shrimp).

If retaining only spot shrimp, then shrimp heads may be removed and discarded in the field.

If retaining any shrimp species other than spot shrimp, then shrimp heads may be removed but must be retained while in the field, until ashore and finished fishing for the day.

The minimum mesh size for shrimp pots is 1" mesh unless the area is closed for spot shrimp.

When mixing bait for shrimp you need to consider the areas you fish. Most of the inner Puget Sound areas are only open for 4 hours so you need to mix your bait such that it is somewhat soupy or like thick pancake batter. My rule for these short 4 hour windows is the bait should be 1/2 to 2/3 gone after an hour soak. I check my pots

every hour. For other areas where you can fish daylight hours thicker bait will allow you leave your pots out for a few hours before checking if so desired.

This is what I use for bait.

- 6 Lb bucket super bait prawn bait (pellets)
- 3.5 lb bag Friskies Seafood flavor dry cat food

Grind dry cat food and shrimp pellets in Cuisinart or blender. Place this mixture in 5 gallon bucket and add

- 64 oz Pro cure crab and shrimp attractant oil, some people use Alaska fish fertilizer instead
- 3 cans Friskies Mariners Catch Pate cat food
- 3 cans Tuna in oil and if you have any left over old herring throw them in there also

I use my cordless drill with a paint mixing attachment to mix thoroughly, add water to get the mixture to correct consistency.

If you have any single salmon eggs that result from curing salmon roe, save them and any reserve liquid to add to the blended mixture. As the shrimp pop the eggs they release an addition scent trail.
