President's Message -- Rob Larsen

Well it is prime time for wild winter steelhead and I know some of you are enjoying some success. I hope to have a fish story of my own by the time we meet. I want to thank all of you that helped at either the sportsman or boat show. You are the reason our club is great. Come learn how and where to fly fish the Puget Sound at this month's meeting. Anil Srivastova owner of Puget Sound Fly has agreed to come and share some of his vast knowledge.

Below is a Letter I sent to a number of folks at WDFW. I believe we have a good chance at getting the changes we are requesting but we need your help to let them know you support these changes. Please read it, and then at our meeting, I will be asking you to write a letter to send to the WDFW. I will bring pre-addressed envelopes and paper so you can write the letter at the meeting. I will collect and send them. See you at the meeting

Good morning,

I am asking you to consider and implement changes that will increase sportsman opportunity on fish not being fully utilized under current regulations. With the current political turmoil in sport fishing politics it would certainly be a good time to implement changes that not only provide increased opportunity but do so with minimal cost. Let me introduce myself, my name is Rob Larsen and I am currently the President of the "Save Our Fish" chapter of PSA. It is my second time serving in the position. I am an avid fisherman and know that fishermen across Washington are very frustrated with the continued down turn of opportunity. With that in mind our chapter of PSA wants to make a difference and past experience has shown me that we can. I joined with another board member and longtime fish advocate (Hal Boynton) to identify and suggest improvements to WDFW for the coming salmon season. The following are opportunities we identified and researched to assure feasibility.

- 1) Provide fishing for both silvers and fall king in Minter creek on the large number for fish that are currently just being sold without any fishing opportunity in Minter creek itself. (Very frustrating to say the least) I have spoken to Deirdre at the hatchery and from our discussion spring Chinook impact would be minimal as the majority has cleared the creek by the time the fall Chinook show up. We need 650 pairs of Fall Chinook for egg take; we had over 10,000 fish this year. For Silvers we need 500 pairs and we had over 15,000 for the last 2 years. If necessary we could have these numbers trigger the opening.
- 2) Open angling for 2000 ft below (or some reasonable distance) below the Bingham creek and Satsop Springs hatcheries on the East Fork Satsop to angling for hatchery Coho and Steelhead. The East Fork Satsop has received excess Coho (over 8000) and Steelhead in recent years but is the only river in Washington where no sport angling is allowed below the hatchery other than handicapped. We understand that the angling closure is to protect Chinook. To minimize the Chinook impact we are proposing only a short stretch. However both Coho and Steelhead runs are later than Chinook and we feel that the impact to Chinook would be minimal.

3) Extend the open stretch on the Green river for Chinook harvest fishery from the Boeing footbridge to 212 St in Kent. Currently the access in the open area is difficult and fishermen would be able to harvest more of the surplus fish with this change.

Puget Sound Anglers appreciate the work many of you do on our behalf and look forward to working together to provide more opportunity in the future for Washington fishermen.

Floats for Sale by SOF

SOF purchased Paulownia wood floats (similar to Thill balsa floats) from Auburn S&M at a deep discount and is offering them to members. They are slightly blemished and were rejected by Beau Mac because the brass ring at the bottom is not well seated. This is probably not a problem if a bead is used below the float, but can be easily fixed by applying silicone or heating the ring to melt the glue to allow reseating. They sell at Sportco for \$3 each. There are six sizes: 1/4 oz, 3/8 oz, 1/2 oz, 5/8 oz, 3/4 oz, and 1 oz. Most bags include a bobber stop and two beads for each float. They are priced as below:

18 bags of 18 floats--3 each of all six sizes for \$20

2 bags of 15 floats--3 of each size (except 3/4 oz) for \$17

19 bags of 12 floats--3 of each of the four smallest sizes for \$12

3 bags of 12 floats--4 each of 5/8, 3/8, and 1/4 oz for \$10

23 bags of 20 floats--10 of each of the two smallest sizes for \$15 (No bobber stops or beads in many of these bags because we ran out.)



Recipe of the Month

Buffalo Chicken Pull-Apart Bread

Ingredients

- 2 cups of cooked and shredded chicken
- 1 cup of Buffalo sauce
- 2 1/2 cups of pepper jack cheese, shredded, divided
- 1/4 cup of chopped scallions
- 2 packages of pizza dough
- 1/2 cup of melted unsalted butter
- Ranch dressing for dipping (optional)
- Green onions for garnish (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Roll out dough and cut into 3x3-inch squares. You should have 15 total squares; arrange in 3 rows of 5.
- 3. In a bowl, toss together shredded chicken, Buffalo sauce, scallions, and half the cheese (1 1/4 cups).
- 4. Brush butter on a dough square and begin to layer ingredients on top. Begin with Buffalo chicken mixture, followed by a sprinkling of cheese. Repeat with remaining squares, stacking one on top of the other, chicken side up.
- 5. Brush the inside of a loaf pan with melted butter. Load stacked bread squares into loaf pan, and brush with remaining butter. Bake for 40 to 50 minutes until desired browning is achieved.
- 6. Garnish with green onions and allow to cool. Serve from baking dish or other serving platter if desired.
