President's Message -- Rob Larsen

There are good numbers of Salmon around. Next week we have the Area 11 opener on July 18 and Areas 7, 9, 10 and 11 all open the same day. This should help keep Area 11 to stay open much longer. Hopefully there will be a lot of fish.

Westport has been on fire and, if you can, it would be a good time to go. Neah Bay has also been producing good numbers of really nice fish and has now gone to a two fish limit.

Sockeye runs on the Columbia are great and Baker Lake is solid. Steelhead on the Columbia and Cowlitz appear to be better than they have been for several years. I made a trip with Scott Olinski, but unfortunately they dropped the water to 2400 the night before and it was slow. We still managed to hook 2 and land one along with two nice sea run cutthroat. The cutthroat made me think of Joe Slepski and his love for these beautiful fish.

The Department has been a little difficult with the way they are announcing the Salmon seasons. They are being very conservative, saying it's only going to be open for three days. I expect Area 11 to be open much longer than that. I can't say that for Areas 7, 9 and 10 although I hope we remain open into September. There has been a lot of Chinook encountered in Area 10 with the Resident Coho season. I think this is a good sign. Get out there and catch some salmon.

I am looking forward to our August steak and corn feed, which is always a good time, and hope all of you will get signed up and let Jim know if you're planning to attend. See you at our meeting on Westport salmon fishing.

July Speaker – Kyle Towle, Pacific NWBestlife

I worked in big tech for 20 years before taking an early "retirement" to spend time with my teenage children. I started the PNWBestLife.com blog, YouTube channel and social media 5 years ago to share my passion for the PNW and sustainable recreational harvest of a variety of foods from salmon and shellfish to big game and mushrooms. I've leveraged my tech background to build some digital tools to help anglers of any experience level have an easier time navigating the learning curve. The escapement, run timing, and creel graphs are just a few of those tools, with more in development and on the way. You can win this trip! We will be selling a deck of cards for \$10 each at this month's meeting. This trip is for six people. Even if you bought every card, it would still be a bargain.


Last year's trip was limits of Chinook. It was a great trip and everybody had fun.


Tip of the Month - Sharp Hooks From Rob Larsen


The hook is what ties you directly to your fish. When the fish bites you have one chance to get it right (in most cases). The quality and condition of your hook is one of the most important factors in your hooking and landing fish.

Inspect your hook often as you are fishing. The bottom is full of rocks and all manner of things that can dull your hook.

it is not bent. Do these things and you will land more fish.

Have a sharpener with you at all times. I know they have become quite expensive but there are some reasonable options. On Amazon you can buy diamond sharpeners that cost less than \$10.

Recipe of the Month

Creamy Baked Salmon

from Delish Recipes Facebook page

2 tablespoons butter
3/4 cup onion, chopped
3 garlic cloves, minced
2 cups tomatoes, diced
3/4 cup cream
2 teaspoons dried basil or 2 teaspoons chopped fresh basil
salt and pepper
4 (6 ounce) salmon fillets



Sauté onion and garlic in butter on medium high until onions are translucent.



Add tomatoes and cook on high for 5 to 10 minutes untill tomatoes start to break a part.

Add cream and simmer on medium low for 5 minutes.

Stir basil, salt and pepper in to cream sauce.

In an oiled baking dish, pour cream sauce over salmon. Cover and bake for 12 minutes at 350°F.
