President's Message -- Rob Larsen

Those of you that want to go to Neah Bay and enjoy the club outing, it will be happening the 13th, 14th and 15th of July. I did get my moorage and they still have moorage available. Lodging is getting a little bit more difficult so don't wait if you plan to go. We will be having a club potluck on Friday night. As we get closer, we will let you know the location.

The North of Falcon process is underway. I attended the first meeting in Lacey and brought up a number of issues, the biggest one being the way that juvenile encounters are counted. I ask what the adult equivalency was and how the finite element analysis utilized the numbers and what I found out was that the number used in the model is more than 20 years old and really doesn't account for how many of those fish would die regardless of if they were encountered. The bottom line on this is that we're likely using a higher number for mortality than what should be used and our seasons are being cut short incorrectly. I did get a chance to talk with Dereck Dapp about this and he is looking for ways to improve the model and try to get some more recent data. Stay tuned -- it will take a while to get any change on this.

We are likely to have a reasonably good Sockeye season on Baker Lake. I plan to go up and get a campsite and spend a few days enjoying the beautiful scenery there and catching some nice Sockeye. I hope some of you will come up as well.

I also must say I am looking forward to our presentation on jetty fishing this month as it is something I have not done, but have thought about many times. Hope to see you all out for the meeting.



March Speaker - MD Johnson, M&J Outdoor Communications

Born and raised in northeast Ohio and spending the years 1997 through 2015 in eastern Iowa, M.D. Johnson is now back in southwest Washington where he apparently belongs. A graduate of Ohio University (1986), Johnson, along with his wife/photographer, Julia, has owned and operated M & J Outdoor Communications, a full-time freelance outdoor writing business since 1993. In addition to his writing, Johnson currently serves as assistant fire chief for Wahkiakum County Fire Protection District 4, has worked as a Red Card-ed wildland firefighter since 2018, and is a substitute teacher for Wahkiakum High School. Waterfowl and so-called "spiny ray fish" are his first outdoor passions; however, he, thanks to his wife, has learned to love bottom fishing, oysters, steamer clams, and bobber fishing for salmon from the North Jetty.

At the meeting MD will be focusing on bottom fishing from the North Jetty at the mouth of the Columbia; however, the tactics covered here could easily be applied to the Westport Jetty or anywhere up and down the West Coast...wherever bottom fish are found. This presentation will spotlight Black Sea bass (rockfish) and smaller ling cod. You don't want to miss this!

Youth Fishing Derby Opportunities Kids Fishing Derbies for 2023




We are so excited to see these fishing derbies for kids back on this year!

Tip of the Month - Baitfish

This tip is for all the saltwater Salmon fishermen/women. The subject is Baitfish. The information was taken from the February Issue of the Salmon Trout Steelheader magazine.

Baitfish

The time of year makes a difference where bait is located as well as the size of bait. The herring spawn occurs from late winter through springtime and adult herring will be in the kelp beds and eel grass bays where they deposit their eggs, which attract underwater vegetation.

Using adult size herring such as blue and green label works when the spawn is on but other times of the year most herring near shore are juvenile fish and that means sizing baits and lures. Anchovies are all but one size when you buy them and use them as baits, but their green color can lend to lures well and you can adjust the size by using artificial baits. Sand lance is another favorite bait fish and once again they are small. You can usually tell when a chinook has been feeding on sand lance as they will often have scars and cuts on their gill plates as they rake the bottom of the ocean where the tiny baitfish prefer to live. If you catch a chinook with these markings, then be sure to downsize the lures and go with more of a silver color.

Fishing for Chinook along the shoreline is not only productive but peaceful. Wildlife watching makes for a great way to pass time between bites and the fishing is often in protected waters. These areas are often used as feeding grounds for Chinook as they head to their spawning grounds. If outside waters are rough, give the shoreline a try and you just may come home with that trophy Chinook or a limit of nice fish.





Recipe of the Month

Shane's Best Darn Razor Clam Dip Ever

With razor clam season upon us, it's time to post this again!

(this is for a double batch)

Ingredients:

2-8 oz. pkgs. of cream cheese

8-10 oz chopped or ground razor clams (I grind mine and usually use necks)

1 Tbs. Worchestershire Sauce

1 Tbs. lemon juice

1 Tbs. garlic powder

3-4 shots of Tabasco Original (shot means shake, not shot glass!)

6-8 shots of Tabasco Chipotle



Cook ground clams in microwave for approx. 2 minutes, stirring after every 20 seconds.

Mix all ingredients together and chill.

*Cool clams in freezer before adding to other ingredients if you want to enjoy right away.
