Speaker -- Nello Picinich, Executive Director of CCA Washington

For those of you who don't know, CCA Washington is an advocacy group for salmon, steelhead, and our other Northwest fish. Their job is to give voice to this precious resource that cannot defend itself against destruction. Nationally the CCA is a non-profit organization comprised of 17 coastal state chapters spanning the Gulf of Mexico, Atlantic and Pacific Coasts. CCA's strength is drawn from the tens of thousands of recreational saltwater anglers who make up its membership. From South Texas to the upper reaches of Maine, CCA's grassroots influence is felt through state capitals, U.S. Congress and, most importantly, in the conservation and restoration of our coastal marine resources.

CCA has been active in virtually every national fisheries debate since 1984 and has participated productively in state and federal fisheries management issues for longer than two decades. CCA continues to operate as a three-tiered organization, affecting issues on the local, state and national levels.

Nello will be giving us an overview of who CCA is and will update us on what successes they have had in 2015, the challenges they faced and what is planned for the 2016 calendar year. Floats for Sale by SOF

SOF purchased Paulownia wood floats (similar to Thill balsa floats) from Auburn S&M at a deep discount and is offering them to members. They are slightly blemished and were rejected by Beau Mac because the brass ring at the bottom is not well seated. This is probably not a problem if a bead is used below the float, but can be easily fixed by applying silicone or heating the ring to melt the glue to allow reseating. They sell at Sportco for \$3 each. There are six sizes: 1/4 oz, 3/8 oz, 1/2 oz, 5/8 oz, 3/4 oz, and 1 oz. Most bags include a bobber stop and two beads for each float. They are priced as below:

18 bags of 18 floats--3 each of all six sizes for \$20

2 bags of 15 floats--3 of each size (except 3/4 oz) for \$17

19 bags of 12 floats--3 of each of the four smallest sizes for \$12

3 bags of 12 floats--4 each of 5/8, 3/8, and 1/4 oz for \$10

23 bags of 20 floats--10 of each of the two smallest sizes for \$15 (No bobber stops or beads in many of these bags because we ran out.)



Recipe of the Month

Grilled Salmon Fillets with Wasabi & Lemon Cream Sauce



2 Servings

Ingredients

Wasabi & Lemon Cream Sauce:

- 2 Tbsps sour cream
- 1½ Tbsps mayonnaise
- 1 2 tsps wasabi
- Juice from ½ lemon
- 1 tsp light soy sauce
- About 3 tsps chopped spring onion (aka scallion)
 - Water

Grilled Salmon:

- 1 Tbsp cooking oil
- ½ Tbsp light soy sauce
- Generous amount of freshly milled black pepper
 - Juice from ½ lemon
 - 2 salmon fillets
 - Dried chilli flakes

Instructions

- 1. To make the sauce, whisk all the ingredients except for the water in a small bowl with a fork until well mixed. Add water gradually to your desired consistency. I actually like the consistency to resemble a thick cream. Cover with a cling wrap and set aside in the fridge.
- 2. While waiting for the griddle to be heated over the stove, on large flat plate, whisk together cooking oil, soy sauce, pepper and lemon juice. Coat the salmon fillets with the marinade on both sides.
- 3. Gently place the salmon fillets over the griddle and cook on both sides until golden brown and the flesh turned opaque on the sides of the salmon fillets.
- 4. To serve, place the salmon fillets on a flat plate and spoon the wasabi-lemon cream sauce over them. Garnish with more freshly milled black pepper, dried chili flakes and chopped spring onions. Serve immediately with your choice of steam vegetables. My pick was steamed green beans.
