
## In Memory of Joe Slepski

His Last Cast

We each see our world through lenses of our own design. Some of us are takers. Some of us are givers. And some of us are champions.

Joe Slepski decided to protect people and wildlife. His life's journey ended in the Cowlitz River Nov. 2 as he cast to perhaps his favorite quarry, searun cutthroat trout.

Some of us first met Joe at Boeing where he was a manager of classified programs in Kent. What struck me about Joe right off the bat was his fierce protection of the people in his organization. Due to the classified nature and controls placed on classified and secure government programs, his staff could not talk about their accomplishments and how their Government customers depended on their services to seamlessly provide for our national security. So, in the never-ending rounds of layoffs and budget cuts, Joe went to battle for his people, often standing in the cross hairs of finance geeks ignorant to the importance of these vital programs. Scores of Boeing engineers in his care owe their longevity at



Boeing to Joe's willingness to stand up for those who were restricted from justifying their worth.

Joe brought that same level of commitment and sacrifice to conserving our priceless fish resources. He was the president of our local Trout Unlimited chapter as well as a long-time board member of the local Puget Sound Anglers chapter. He was one of the founding members and president of the SeaTac Chapter of the Coastal Conservation Association, one of the first CCA chapters in Washington. He cultivated a team that raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for fish conservation and helped raise awareness of the declining health of our fish populations.

He was never hesitant about getting his hands dirty (or wet), helping kids catch their first trout at local kids' trout derbies, planting trees, rewilding and improving spawning streams, and volunteering for all kinds of fish conservation projects spanning several decades.

He also brought his considerable leadership experience to bear in the fish politics arena. As a shining example, He faced down the City of Tacoma when they refused to provide fish passage at the Green River's Howard Hanson Dam. They eventually instituted a trap-and truck process to restore wild steelhead to the pristine waters of the upper Green's watershed. Much of the credit goes to Joe and the unlikely coalition of usual enemies he cobbled together. That powerful group included City bureaucrats, US Army Corps of Engineers dam experts, citizen volunteers, WDFW biologists, Tribal biologists, fish managers, and recreational fishermen.

A few years ago, he took on the ambitious task of repopulating Puget Sound with native Olympia oysters, starting at Penrose Park. Once again, Joe sought the involvement of many different groups to establish the credibility of his concept, secure funding for the implementation and maintenance of the oysters, and nurture community involvement to ensure continued widespread support.

We lost a tireless giant for fish and wildlife conservation when Joe made his last cast. In lieu of flowers, the family has asked that remembrances be made to CCA. https://ccawashington.org/donation/

# **Recipe of the Month**

# **Walnut-Rosemary Crusted Salmon**



You can't beat this delicious Walnut-Rosemary Crusted Salmon dish for good nutrition, since both salmon and walnuts are great sources of omega-3 fatty acids. This is a simple salmon recipe that will wow your family and impress your friends.

Prep Time: 10 minutes
Cook Time: 10 minutes
Total Time: 20 minutes

• Yield: Serves 4

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1/4 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon chopped fresh rosemary
- 1/2 teaspoon honey
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 3 tablespoon panko breadcrumbs
- 3 tablespoon finely chopped walnuts
- 1 teaspoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 (1-pound) skinless salmon fillet, fresh or frozen
- Olive oil cooking spray
- Chopped fresh parsley and lemon wedges for garnish

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Line a large, rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Combine mustard, garlic, lemon zest, lemon juice, rosemary, honey, salt, and crushed red pepper in a small bowl.
- 3. Combine panko, walnuts, and oil in another small bowl.
- 4. Place salmon on the prepared baking sheet. Spread the mustard mixture over the fish and sprinkle with the panko mixture, pressing to adhere. Lightly coat with cooking spray.
- 5. Bake about 8 to 10 minutes, until the fish flakes easily with a fork, depending on thickness.
- 6. Sprinkle with parsley and serve with lemon wedges as garnish, if desired.
