State board meeting Ron Garner shared that between the tribes and the state there are approximately 18,000,000 additional salmon being raised in Washington hatcheries. Ron stated the following in a letter to PSA leadership. "This is a huge victory for all of us from working with the coastal people, WDFW, Tribes, Governor's Office, PFMC, and NOAA to get to this point. This additional production for the Orca and all of us, goes all of the way back to Butch Smith and I working together to save WDFW Commissioner Larry Carpenter to keep him and still get a pro-hatchery then new commissioner Don McIsaac, with the Governor's office. Larry was gone and we were successful in keeping Larry while getting Don in. This was all about getting back to producing salmon out of our hatcheries due all of the negativity against them. Butch started working the coastal tribes and I started with the PS tribes to get us together so we all can bring back salmon. It has been a successful coalition to date. This is the most successful achievement to date." Let's hope that through our efforts we can keep hatchery production going up.

Founders Award



Tip of the Month -- Fish Finder Tips from Earl Betts

Tip #1

Using a Fish Finder Effectively To Locate More Fish.

It's all about underwater structure.

Fish finders are far more valuable for locating underwater structure where fish hang out or schools of bait fish that large fish feed on, than for locating the actual fish.

A critical first step in effectively locating fish in large bodies of water is to obtain and study the underwater charts of the fishing area before hitting the water.

Charts are available on line, through state agencies or at local fishing supply stores. Studying charts will help give you an overall picture of where the areas are that are most likely to attract and hold fish. Once a piece of viable structure has been located on a chart the next step is to get on the water and find the structure with the fish finder. This is where a fish finder can differentiate the great fishing spots from the average ones.

Tip #2

Seeing Your Downrigger Ball Depth on the Fish Finder.

If you want to monitor your downrigger ball depth on your fish finder make sure you have the fish finder frequency set to 50 kHz to 83 kHz depending on the make/model. This will give you the widest cone angle under the boat. As you lower the downrigger ball you should see a line going down the screen. Once your downrigger ball is set to whatever depth your fishing you should see a horizontal line across your screen at the same depth as your downrigger gauge.

Recipe of the Month

Absolutely Delicious Zucchini Cobbler

I challenge you to serve this to your family and not tell them what is in it. They will swear it is apple cobbler!

If you were at the Steak and Corn Feed in August, it was on the dessert table.

The chopped zucchini is cooked with lemon juice and spiced with cinnamon and nutmeg, backed in a

crumble crust and served warm or cold with whipped cream! Delicious.....!!!!



INGREDIENTS:

8 cups peeled, chopped zucchini 2/3 cup lemon juice 1 cup white sugar 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg 4 cups all-purpose flour 2 cups white sugar 1 1/2 cups butter, chilled

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In a large saucepan over medium heat, cook and stir zucchini and lemon juice until zucchini is tender, 15 to 20 minutes. Stir in 1 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon and nutmeg and cook one minute more. Remove from heat and set aside.
- 2. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease a 10x15 inch baking dish. In a large bowl, combine flour and 2 cups sugar. Cut in butter with pastry blender or two knives until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir 1/2 cup of butter mixture into zucchini mixture. Press half of remaining butter mixture into bottom of prepared pan. Spread zucchini mixture over top of crust, and sprinkle remaining butter mixture over zucchini. Sprinkle with 1 teaspoon cinnamon.
- 3. Bake 35 to 40 minutes, or until top is golden. Serve warm or cold.
