




Thanks to Matt Anderson and Jim Hand for the delicious steaks!



Floats for Sale by SOF

SOF purchased Paulownia wood floats (similar to Thill balsa floats) from Auburn S&M at a deep discount and is offering them to members. They are slightly blemished and were rejected by Beau Mac because the brass ring at the bottom is not well seated. This is probably not a problem if a bead is used below the float, but can be easily fixed by applying silicone or heating the ring to melt the glue to allow reseating. They sell at Sportco for \$3 each. There are six sizes: 1/4 oz, 3/8 oz, 1/2 oz, 5/8 oz, 3/4 oz, and 1 oz. Most bags include a bobber stop and two beads for each float. They are priced as below:

18 bags of 18 floats--3 each of all six sizes for \$20

2 bags of 15 floats--3 of each size (except 3/4 oz) for \$17

19 bags of 12 floats--3 of each of the four smallest sizes for \$12

3 bags of 12 floats--4 each of 5/8, 3/8, and 1/4 oz for \$10

23 bags of 20 floats--10 of each of the two smallest sizes for \$15 (No bobber stops or beads in many of these bags because we ran out.)



Recipe of the Month

Fish with Roasted Tomato Sauce

Fish with Roasted Tomato Sauce



Cut fish to desired serving sizes. Place fish in a greased baking pan for the oven or a foil packet for the grill. Cover each serving of fish liberally with sauce and parmesan cheese. Bake in a preheated 350° oven or on a medium-hot grill 15-20 minutes or until

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pound bottom fish
- 2 cups Roasted Tomato Sauce
- 1/2 cup shredded parmesan cheese

fish is no longer opaque and reaches an internal temperature of at least 135°.

ROASTED TOMATO SAUCE

- 3 pounds tomatoes (any size or variety will work)
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 8-10 cloves garlic
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 1 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 cup fresh basil, optional

Place onions and garlic in the bottom of a 9" x 11" casserole pan. Cut tomatoes in half and place on top of the onions and garlic. Add salt, pepper and oil. Place in a 325° oven and roast 1 hour. Stir mixture and reduce temperature to 300°. Continue roasting until most of the liquid has evaporated, check every 20 minutes. The longer tomatoes roast, the sweeter they become. Serve as is if you like a lot of texture in your sauce or use a stand or hand blender to puree mixture. Add fresh basil if desired.
