## President's Message -- Rob Larsen

Well, here we are in September already and, with the past week of rain, the fish are moving and good numbers of Silvers are being taken in the Sound and Kings and Silvers are moving up the rivers. With all the restrictions, we still have some good options. The Puyallup and Green are both good options for the next month. On October 16th we can fish Minter Creek for SIlvers for the first time thanks to our club's efforts. On the 20th of October we are having an outing -- fishing in the morning and then at 12noon we will do a cleanup and education effort at Minter Creek. If you can, come have a good time and help out.

You may have noticed a significant effort form Ron Gardner, our state PSA president, to educate the public on the problems with predators on our fish. He was able to get on the Governor's Orca task force, helping the public

understand the critical threat that the huge increase in pinnipeds pose to the Orcas. The pinniped population both seals and sea lions has increased by at least tenfold. The increased fish consumption of these protected species is responsible for the decline in food for the Orcas. We all need to become familiar with and share this information with the people we are around because we need help to change laws to reduce these predators if we want to have salmon and steelhead in our future. We will also need the voters to help us increase salmon production if we are to recover the Orcas and be allowed to continue to salmon fish. I challenge each of you to help educate the general population understand the need to remove some of the pinnipeds.

Well, I hope to see many of you at our meeting and wish you all tight lines. You are what makes our club great. Thanks for all you are doing.




#### Mike Wood Memorial Fall Outing - Oct 26-27

# **Tip of the Month** from Bob Holzberger



## Fishing the Puyallup

There are many successful techniques to fish on the Puyallup -- spinners, spoons, eggs -- but the vast majority of people are drift fishing corkies. If you find yourself on a crowded gravel bar you will most likely need to do the same. The key to drift fishing corkies is getting your presentation in the correct water column where the fish are moving. Adjust your weight, hook size, and corky size to the conditions you are presented with. Pay attention to the successful

fishermen around you. Size and weight are much more important than color in the dirty glacier water.

#### Floats for Sale by SOF

SOF purchased Paulownia wood floats (similar to Thill balsa floats) from Auburn S&M at a deep discount and is offering them to members. They are slightly blemished and were rejected by Beau Mac because the brass ring at the bottom is not well seated. This is probably not a problem if a bead is used below the float, but can be easily fixed by applying silicone or heating the ring to melt the glue to allow reseating. They sell at Sportco for \$3 each. There are six sizes: 1/4 oz, 3/8 oz, 1/2 oz, 5/8 oz, 3/4 oz, and 1 oz. Most bags include a bobber stop and two beads for each float. They are priced as below:

18 bags of 18 floats--3 each of all six sizes for \$20

2 bags of 15 floats--3 of each size (except 3/4 oz) for \$17

19 bags of 12 floats--3 of each of the four smallest sizes for \$12

3 bags of 12 floats--4 each of 5/8, 3/8, and 1/4 oz for \$10

23 bags of 20 floats--10 of each of the two smallest sizes for \$15 (No bobber stops or beads in many of these bags because we ran out.)



# **Recipe of the Month**

# Peanut Butter Oat Squares

## **Ingredients**

- 1 cup Peanut Butter (does not work well with natural PB)
- 3 cups Oats
- 1/2 cup Honey



### **Directions**

- 1. Line a 9×9 pan with non-stick foil, or regular foil as long as you use a non-stick spray
- 2. Melt the honey and peanut butter together until it's smooth enough to mix with the oats. I do this in the microwave for approximately 1-2 minutes because it's faster, but you can also melt it on the stove top if you'd prefer
- 3. Combine the mixture with the oats (start off with 2 cups and slowly add the rest as you may need less depending on your peanut butter and honey brand), and then mix well
- 4. Pour it into your prepared pan, and then store it in the refrigerator for a few hours until it's set enough to cut into squares. You can store them in the refrigerator to keep them firm, or leave them out if you like them soft and sticky
