

Tip of the Month -- A Different Fly The Boobie Fly from Joe Slepski

Most of you are familiar with the standard types of flies. Wet, dry, streamer, nymphs and midges are standard types of flies. There is a fly invented in Europe that I have been told was banned. Not really sure if this is true, but it makes a good story. It was first shown to me when we hired Brian Chan for a guided trip in British Columbia. We weren't catching much, so he put on this fly, cast it toward the shore and stripped it fast. He hooked a fish on his first cast, so it will catch fish. The standard pattern is a fly tied with foam eyes and fished on a sinking line. The idea is that fished on a sinking line, the strip will pull it down and on the pause, it will float up. It is said to agitate the fish and cause them to strike at the fly.

What I found it useful for is fishing for Pink Salmon. It is tied on any regular salt water hook around a size 4. I tie it with white foam eyes, a pink flashy body and white and pink wing. Marabou works good on the wing. I doubt it is very critical, as long as there is a lot of pink. As you know, the Pink salmon can be successfully

caught using pink jigs using a twitching technique. The jig sinks and when twitched it jumps up. The Boobie fly does the opposite. The sinking fly line pulls it down and when you do a quick retrieve, it floats back up. I have used this fly successfully in the Sound and also in the Skykomish.

I have thought about trying this fly for silvers, but haven't had a good opportunity yet.



Recipe of the Month Taco Stuffed Zucchini Boats

These taco stuffed zucchini boats are a healthy, gluten-

free, low-carb, Mexican-inspired dinner!

Ingredients

- 4 large zucchini (Editor note: Yeah, right...My zucchini are so large that I only used 1!!!)
- 1 pound ground beef

Taco Seasoning (You can make this seasoning or just use a packet of Taco seasoning already made)

- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- ½ teaspoon oregano
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Toppings

- ½ cup sour cream
- 3 green onions thinly sliced
- 2 Roma tomatoes diced
- 1 avocado thinly sliced
- 1 bunch fresh cilantro
- 1 lime to squeeze on top

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375°F (190°C). Heat a large skillet on medium heat and add the ground beef. Use your spatula to break up the beef. Add the spices, stir to combine, and cook for 7 to 10 minutes or until browned.
- 2. While the ground beef is cooking, slice the zucchini in half lengthwise and use a spoon to scoop out the insides.

- 3. Place the zucchini on a parchment-lined baking tray and fill with the ground beef. Cook for 15 to 20 minutes in the oven, or until the tops are browned and the zucchini is slightly softened.
- 4. Remove the stuffed zucchini from the oven and drizzle with sour cream, a sprinkle of diced tomatoes and green onions, a few slices of avocado, some fresh cilantro, and a squeeze of lime juice.
