Tip of the Month - Monofilament Line From Kathy Carnino

Did you know the lifespan of monofilament line is at least one year? Some avid fishermen and women change their line after every trip. The durability of your fishing line depends on how much you use them. If you are a moderate to heavy fisher it is recommended that you change your line 2 to 4 times a year.

Monofilament Line

Advantages-Mono is the most popular type of fishing line and comes in a large variety of strengths and colors. It is less expensive, stretches to absorb shock, is abrasion resistant, easy to tie knots, and stays on the reel neatly.

Disadvantages-It can suffer from memory, Mono is not as strong as braid. It is made of nylon, which can break down over time, especially when exposed to sunlight. It is recommended you respool your reels at least once a year.

Best overall Monofilament Line - Maxima Ultragreen

Fall/Winter is right around the corner, which is a good time to respool your reels with new fishing line for 2025 season. You might even find a deal or two during the holiday season.

Recipe of the Month

ZUCCHINI QUICHE WITH BACON AND HASH BROWN CRUST

from Cooking with Emma Facebook page

Ingredients:

Hash Brown Crust

- 3 cups refrigerated or frozen hash browns thawed, patted dry
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter melted

Quiche Filling

- 1/2 lb bacon cooked, crumbled
- 1 shallot diced
- 1 medium zucchini
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black pepper
- 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 5 eggs room temperature
- 1 cup plain Greek yogurt
- 3 cups shredded cheese (Sharp Cheddar, Gruyere, Monterey

Jack, Dubliner, Pepper Jack - a combination of 2 or more works

best)

Instructions:

Grate the zucchini onto a clean kitchen towel and squeeze dry, removing as much excess liquid as possible. Set aside.

Hash Brown Crust

Preheat oven to 400F. Coat a 9-inch pie plate with non-stick cooking spray. Set aside.

In a medium bowl, combine, hash browns, olive oil, butter, salt, and pepper and toss to combine.

Press hash browns into the bottom and up the sides of the pie plate firmly, forming a crust. You want it to go all the way up the sides because it will shrink some while baking.

Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until the edges are golden brown.

Reduce oven temperature to 350F.

Quiche Filling

Cook bacon in a large sauté pan over medium high heat until crispy, about 6 to 8 minutes on each side. Remove from skillet and crumble into small pieces.

Remove all but one tablespoon of the bacon grease from the skillet. Add the diced shallots and sauté over medium heat for 3 to 4 minutes or until translucent and soft.


Add shredded zucchini turn up the heat to high. Season with salt and pepper. Cook the zucchini and shallots for an additional 3 to 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Combine the flour, baking powder, and salt in a small bowl.

In a separate bowl, beat the eggs until nice and fluffy (2 to 3 minutes). Whisk in the Greek yogurt until combined and smooth.

Add in the grated cheese, flour mixture, bacon, and zucchini mixture and stir until combined.

Pour filling into hash brown crust and bake for 35 to 40 minutes or until center is set, the top is puffed and golden brown and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Let stand for several minutes before removing from pan and serving. Can also be eaten room temperature or chilled.
